Guidance for Selecting and Using Text from the HUSD 6th- 12th Grades Novel List

General Guidelines:

- **Board Approval:** The District Governing Board has final approval of all 6th – 12th Grades Approved Novel List titles and their assigned grade levels.
- **Novel Selection:** Teachers must choose novels from the approved 6th – 12th Grades Approved Novel List.
- **Choice Lists:** If a teacher provides students with a list of novel choices, the options must come from the 6th – 12th Grades Approved Novel List. For sensitive titles, teachers must adhere to the Guidelines for Sensitive Titles.
- **Student Selected Novel:** If a student is self-selecting a novel for an assignment, a permission slip is required to be sent home.
- **K-5 Literature:** Kindergarten through fifth grade teachers may select novel of the HMH Trade Book List. If teachers want to use a text not in the district approved curriculum, they must get approval from their site-administration and adhere to A.R.S. 15-120.03.
- **Syllabus Requirements:** Titles to be read throughout the year must be published on the teacher's course syllabus or newsletter at the beginning of the year. A parent or guardian signature on the syllabus is required. If a text is added later in the year, a permission slip must be sent home for the added text. If a novel with sensitive content is listed, the teacher will follow the Guidelines for Sensitive Titles.
- **Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment:** Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment are opt-in courses designed for students who choose to engage in college-level work. Participation in these courses requires a level of maturity and readiness for high school students to thoughtfully analyze a variety of texts, including those that may be considered controversial.
 - Advanced Placement courses have special considerations given to books recommended by the College Board that students must know to succeed on the AP English exams. AP teachers must follow the parameters of their courses as outlined by the College Board.
 - Novels used in the Dual Enrollment courses must be approved by the partner community colleges. Teachers must follow the parameters of their community college courses.

Guidelines for Sensitive Titles:

- **Notification:** Parents must be notified in writing of the sensitive nature of any assigned title, or any title listed as a choice, at least two weeks prior. All subsequent guidelines must be followed.
- **Syllabus Listing:** The title will be listed on the syllabus or newsletter at the beginning of the year.
 - Titles with sensitive content must be identified as such on the syllabus.
 - An alternate title will be listed for each sensitive title.
 - A parental/ legal guardian consent letter will be completed and sent home at least two weeks prior to the novel being used.
 - Parents/ legal guardians can opt out of the sensitive title, with the alternate title assigned in its place. Specific guidelines are in place for opting out.
 - Teachers will obtain a parent/ legal guardian signature on the syllabus novel list. This does not count as permission for novels with sensitive content.
- **Parental Consent:** If a novel is assigned after the syllabus or newsletter is sent home, parents must be notified in writing at least two weeks prior to the novel being used. A parent consent letter will be completed by the teacher and sent home.
- **Principal Awareness:** Teachers will inform the site-administrator of the sensitive title that will be taught and discussed in class.
- **Resource Review:** Teachers will review district-approved resources for the novel being taught.

Guidance for the HUSD 6th - 12th Grades Novel Review Committee

Overview of the Secondary Novel Review Committee:

The HUSD 6th – 12th Grades Novel Review Committee is established to facilitate book proposals and reviews within the currently adopted curriculum. This committee includes HUSD teachers, administrators, district personnel, and parents.

Membership: If anyone wishes to apply to this committee, please click on this [link](#). The committee meets as needed, particularly when:

- A teacher proposes a new book for the curriculum.
- A review of an existing approved book is suggested.

Process to Propose a New Book to the Curriculum:

- **Proposal Form:** Teachers proposing a new book must complete this [form](#) detailing the book's summary, instructional purpose, and content concerns. Principals must be informed of and approve of the proposal.
- **Submission:** The completed form is submitted to the HUSD 6th – 12th Grades Novel Review Committee for evaluation.
- **Evaluation:** The committee reads and evaluates the book using a rubric designed to guide their discussion and formulate a recommendation.
- **Consensus and Recommendation:** The committee reaches a consensus on the recommendation.
- **Governing Board Approval:** Recommendations are presented to the Governing Board for final approval. This is done once a semester.
- **Supplemental Book List:** If approved, the book is added to the 6th – 12th Grades Approved Novel List.

Process to Change a Level of a Book:

- **Request Submission:** Teachers requesting a grade level change for a book submit their request to the campus's curriculum team representative (Assistant Principal of Curriculum and Instruction).
- **Curriculum Team Discussion:** The grade level change suggestion is added to the agenda of the upcoming curriculum team (AP of Curriculum and Instruction, Dept. Chair, grade level representatives) meeting.
- **Merit Evaluation:** The curriculum team discusses the merits of the change and makes a recommendation.
- **Escalation:** If the curriculum team cannot reach a consensus, the suggestion is escalated to the Secondary Novel Review Committee.
- **Committee Evaluation:** The HUSD 6th – 12th Grades Novel Review Committee discusses the merits and makes its recommendation, which is then reflected on the 6th – 12th Grades Approved Novel List.

Process to Suggest a Review of a Book:

- **Initial Concerns:** Community members who have concerns about an approved book discuss these concerns with a teacher, media specialist, or administrator.
- **Formal Submission:** The community member fills out a form outlining their concerns and submits it to the HUSD 6th – 12th Grades Novel Review Committee.
- **Evaluation:** The committee reads and evaluates the book using a rubric to focus their discussion.
- **Recommendation:** The committee makes a recommendation to either keep or remove the book from classroom use. They may also suggest a different grade level placement for the book.
